Judie,

Attached is a scope of work from Dr. Steve Bortone of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation Marine Laboratory designed to provide technical data on the scope and status of the algae bloom along our shorelines and the health of our local seagrass beds. I recommend that we employ the lab to investigate these items so that we can accurately track some of the continuing effects of the excessive polluted freshwater discharges from Lake Okeechobee. The Foundation as our partner has agreed to cost-share \$4,124 (@20%) in salaries of the total project cost of \$21,224; leaving the City's proposed @80% share at \$17,100. If Council supports this expenditure, it could be re-allocated from the contingency fund.
