

Breast cancer remains the second leading cause of cancer deaths among American women and one in every eight females will be diagnosed with this disease during her lifetime; and

WHEREAS: *Men and women should be aware that age, obesity, genetics, and family history are factors that can contribute to the risk of developing this disease; and*

WHEREAS: *Ninety -eight percent of those living with cancer have a greater chance of survival when it is detected early; and*

WHEREAS: *Early detection and prompt treatment can significantly reduce the suffering and deaths caused by this disease and yearly mammograms and clinical breast examinations are recommended for women starting at age 40; and*

WHEREAS: *Mammography is the best available method of detecting breast changes and regular screenings are a woman's best chance for detecting breast cancer early, which can significantly improve a woman's chance for survival from breast cancer; and*

WHEREAS: *Monthly self-examinations, beginning in a woman's early 20s, are also a key part in detecting any abnormalities or changes.*

WHEREAS: *Since the City began the Mobile Mammo Coach visits at the Recreation Center on October 1st 2010, Radiology Regional has screened a total of 197 mamographies. 115 of these mamographies were done in the year 2011-2012.*

NOW, THEREFORE, *I, Kevin Ruane, Mayor of the City of Sanibel, Lee County, Florida on behalf of the members of Sanibel City Council and the citizens of Sanibel, declare the month of October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month in the City of Sanibel and urge all citizens and employees of the City at risk for breast cancer to use appropriate screenings that can detect it at its early stages.*
