SECTION 1. The following persons are hereby appointed to the Sanibel Historical Preservation Committee:

The terms for each of the above members shall commence on May 06, 2014 and expire on March 16, 2015, provided, however, each member shall be authorized to continue to serve on the Committee until such member is reappointed to that seat, or until a new member is appointed to that seat, or until Council adopts a Resolution declaring such seat vacant.

 Late 1970's co-compiled the Ecozones Maps of Sanibel and worked in the Sanibel Planning Department.

1984 to 2011, had a Planning career in the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern working with Monroe County, Florida Department of Community Affairs, City of Key West and as a private consultant. Was the Key West City Planner from 1998 to 2006, during which worked with the Key West Historic Architectural Review Commission and their staff.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:

As a recent full time resident I have been careful to avoid over committing to volunteer activities. I have been working full time as a naturalist at Tarpon Bay Explorers and wanted to finish the season before taking on more obligations.

I have been personally involved with Sanibel my entire life. As a child we would visit my grandmother, Daisy Mayer, the original owner of Shore Haven and my cousins the Dormers. My aunt Elinore Dormer wrote The Sea Shell Islands, a history of Sanibel and Captiva.

In 1968 my family moved to Sanibel and I graduated from Cypress Lake High School in 1970. I then attended the University of Michigan and did not fully return until 1977 to start working in the Sanibel Planning Department.

In 1980 I went back to college to get a Master of Regional Planning Degree from the University of North Carolina and only briefly returned in late 1983 to early 1984 before moving to the Florida Keys to assist with writing the Monroe County Comprehensive Land Use Plan. This led to my above mentioned career as a Planner in the Florida Keys.

While on Sanibel in 1978, I moved the old Fitzhugh house from Periwinkle Way to its present location on Bay Drive. This is now my permanent home.

WHY ARE YOU INTERESTED IN THIS APPOINTMENT?

I have a very personal connection to Sanibel going back many years and including my family's history. I recall riding the ferry, seeing the bridge being built and buying jaw breakers and comic books from Bailey's when it was on the Bay.

The Historic Preservation Committee has many accomplishments such as the historic plaques, cooperation with SCCF for the acquisition of the Bailey homestead and of course, assistance with the successful relocation of Shore Haven. My hope is that my experience in Planning will be helpful to the other committee members as we take on the many future projects and continue ongoing endeavors.

In 1982 I served on the committee that founded the Historic Village and am so credited on the plaque adjacent to the front door of Clarence Rutland's house. I now greatly look forward to resuming this dedication to preserving Sanibel's history.



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
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
