RE: Periwinkle Way Corridor Restoration – Phase 3

RECOMMENDATION: Award Periwinkle Way Corridor Restoration – Phase 3 contract to All Native Garden Center & Plant Nursery, Inc. in the amount of \$36,145.00 and authorize the City Manager to execute the contract.

Following Hurricane Charley's destruction of the vegetation along the Periwinkle Way Corridor, the City, along with the other members of the Periwinkle Partnership, have worked to restore the vegetation. The first phase of the restoration project involved the replacement of the canopy trees through funding by the City, Periwinkle Partnership, and Federal Grants. The second phase involves establishment of native planting areas including various combinations of native plantings, benches, water fountains, and picnic tables. Plans were developed for Phase 3 of the restoration project, consisting of understory plantings, involving shrubs, bushes and flowers to supplement the trees along Periwinkle Way from Causeway Boulevard to Palm Ridge Road and along Palm Ridge Road.

In response to an advertisement for bids, which appeared in the June 9, 2008 edition of the Ft. Myers News-Press, five contractors submitted bids for the project. The bids were opened and read aloud on July 3, 2008 in the presence of Katie Myers from Hannula Landscaping, John Sibley of All Native Garden Center, John Hussion of Southern Tradition Landscaping, and Scott Krawczuk and Gates Castle from the City. As indicated on the attached Bid Tabulation, the low bid was submitted by All Native Garden Center & Plant Nursery, Inc. in the amount of \$36,145.00.

Staff recommends that Council award the Periwinkle Way Corridor Restoration – Phase 3 contract to All Native Garden Center & Plant Nursery, Inc. in the amount of \$36,145.00 and authorize the City Manager to execute the contract (copy attached). Periwinkle Partnership will fund the work with assistance from a 50% reimbursement through a Lee County grant.
