Bring Your Skills to the Island Seniors Board of Directors



Hurricane Preparedness Program

Please join FISH for their second annual Hurricane Preparedness Seminar on Thursday, June 20 from 10:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. at the Sanibel Community House, 2173 Periwinkle Way. Lance S. Henninger, Sanibel Emergency Management and Debbie Quimby, Lee County Emergency Management Coordinator will be featured speakers, along with Kathy Y. Monroe, Program Director. The seminar will provide information and stress the importance of making an evacuation plan. This seminar is open to the community. There will be the opportunity for individuals to receive the FISH Hurricane Preparedness Resource Packet.

The FISH Hurricane Program is a collaborative effort Between FISH, City officials and emergency management teams to assist our neighbors. FISH maintains a list of those most vulnerable such as the elderly, those with health and Medical conditions, and those who are alone. FISH volunteers conduct home visitations, if requested, to discuss evacuation plans. FISH shares information, with the individual's consent, with officials and out-of-state family members should a storm become a concern for our area. The FISH Hurricane Resource Packet provides detailed information on where to go, what to do, and how to prepare in the event of an approaching storm. In addition to distribution at the seminar, FISH Hurricane Resource Packets are available at the Walk-In Center, 2430-B Periwinkle Way, Mon.-Fri. from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. beginning June 21st. 




After Anna by Lisa Scottoline

Wednesday, June 12 First published in *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil: A Savannah Story* (1994) is a memoir-thriller by writer and *Esquire*-*New York Magazine* editor John Berendt. Based in Savannah, Georgia in the early to mid 1980s, the story follows a colorful cast of local characters as they live their daily life during a nationally infamous murder trial. *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil* was adapted to a movie in 1997 and was on the *New York Times* Bestseller list for over four years, setting the record for most time spent on the list. The book was also a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize. Many critics praised it for its atmospheric portrayal of an American city. The work uses more than eight years' worth of interviews Berendt had with residents of Savannah. — Supersummary.com



Boy Erased by Garrard Conley
Wednesday, July 10 The son of a Baptist pastor and deeply embedded in church life in small town Arkansas, as a young man Garrard Conley was terrified and conflicted about his sexuality. When Garrard was a nineteen-year-old college student, he was outed to his parents, and was forced to make a life-changing decision: either agree to attend a church-supported conversion therapy program that promised to "cure" him of homosexuality; or risk losing family, friends, and the God he had prayed to every day of his life. Through an institutionalized Twelve-Step Program heavy on Bible study, he was supposed to emerge heterosexual, ex-gay, cleansed of impure urges and stronger in his faith in God for his brush with sin. Instead, even when faced with a harrowing and brutal journey, Garrard found the strength and understanding to break out in search of his true self and forgiveness. — Goodreads





Hamilton is the story of America's founding father Alexander Hamilton, an immigrant from the West Indies who became George Washington's right-hand man during the Revolutionary War and was the new nation's first treasury secretary. 
