World War I, also known as "The Great War," was responsible for the death of roughly 40 million military and civilian casualties.

A century ago, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, a ceasefire agreement brought silence to the most destructive and gruesome war, known as the "war to end all wars." This agreement was made between Allied nations and Germany and was known as "Armistice Day."

November 11, 1918 was commemorated throughout the world as a day of peace. The tolling of bells was, and still is today, a traditional expression of honor and remembrance for those millions of soldiers who gave their lives, who were wounded, and for the millions of civilians whose lives ended due to either the horrific war, illness, or starvation.

On May 13, 1938, the eleventh day of November was declared a legal holiday and was known as Armistice Day. Today the world is commemorating the 101st anniversary of the Armistice that ended the fighting in World War I at 11:00 a.m., November 11, 1918. Today, Veterans Day is celebrated every year on November 11th in honor of all those who served our country in Military service.

Speaker

Colonel Tim Moore, USAF (Ret.)

Tim Moore is both a retired USAF Colonel and a retired Foreign Service Officer having served over 35 years with the US Government. Currently, Tim is the Vice Commander for the American Legion Post 123, Sanibel and the Vice President of the Lee Chapter of the Military Officer's Association of American.

Tim's 26-year service in the USAF included being the Director of the Joint Air to Service Standoff Missile Program (2000 – 2003); an Attaché at the US Embassy, London (1993-1996); and a Test Pilot for the B-2 Development Program (1988 – 1993).

Before entering the Foreign Service, Tim worked for the Governor of Florida as a Defense Coordinator for the Governor of Florida for a year (2004-2005). Subsequently, he worked two years with the State Department in Baghdad directing the Ministerial Coordination Team for the Iraq Reconstruction Management Office (2005-2007).

In 2008, Tim joined the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and returned to Iraq where he worked as a Senior Development Advisor in Al Anbar and later in Kirkuk (2008-2010). He next worked as Deputy Executive Officer for USAID in Pretoria, South Africa (2010-2012). Subsequent assignments were in Pakistan, where Tim served as the Director, Deputy Director, and Senior Energy Advisor for the USAID Energy Office managing a \$400 million energy budget (2012-2016).

Tim holds a Bachelor of Science degree in physics from Florida Atlantic University, a Master of Arts degree in physics from the University of California, and a Master of Science degree in National Resource Strategy from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces (now the Eisenhower Institute).

Tim has two children, Katie and Adam, and 3 grandchildren. He is married to Catherine Moore, also a retired USAID Foreign Service Officer. His interest in traveling overseas grew from two years living in Bombay (now Mumbai) India and going to high school in New Delhi. Tim enjoys music (playing and listening) and swimming.

Chad Maik, Sanibel Police Officer

Public Service and Academic Achievement of Chad Maik

Officer Chad Maik joined the Sanibel Police Department in 2015. In 2016 Officer Maik was sworn into the position of Police Officer. During his tenure with the City of Sanibel Officer Maik has been recognized with the Combat Cross medal as well as the Lifesaving Commendation. As a Sanibel Police officer, Maik has earned his bicycle patrol officer certification, patrol rifle certification, FDLE law enforcement certification, ASP expandable baton certification, TASER certification, RADAR/ LASER speed detection certification, FWC alligator agent license and more. Academically, Maik earned 29 credits at the Community College of the Air Force and transferred the credits to the Florida SouthWestern State (FSW) college Criminal Justice associate degree program with an expected completion date of 2021.

Military Service of Chad Maik

Chad Maik dedicated 8 years to United States Military Service as a United States Air Force Senior Airman. For four years Maik served as active duty military police officer and four years USAF reserve military officer. In 2010 Maik was deployed to combat in Iraq in support of Operation Freedom and Operation New Dawn. During this time, he served as a HUMVEE turret machine-gunner and Barrett M107 .50 caliber rifleman.

Officer Maik was also awarded the Air Force achievement Medal for providing first aide to a juvenile burn victim in combat zone. Maik served as a "Z-backscatter" material equipment operator/inspector, Cobalt-60 synthetic radioactive material and Caesium-137 radioactive material equipment operator/inspector, and HUMVEE fleet management. In 2011 Maik was awarded his Base Defense Operations Center Controller certification and 911 military dispatcher certification and supervised 20+ military police officers. In 2012 Maik was deployed Kyrgyzstan for approximately 180 days in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, Afghanistan. During this time Maik supervised 30+ U.S. military police officers.
