PROCLAMATION NO. 20-017

AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL EXTENDING THE DECLARED STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); EXTENDING OTHER EMERGENCY PROCLAMATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency for a period of seven (7) days in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-52, declaring a State of Emergency for the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution Number 20-011 (attached hereto as Exhibit 1, less exhibits), declaring a State of Local Emergency for the City of Sanibel for a period of seven (7) days, resulting from the outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-014 (attached hereto as Exhibit 2), extending for seven (7) days the State of Local Emergency and ratifying the Mayoral Proclamations prohibiting and restricting certain activities; and

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3), Florida Statutes, provides certain emergency powers to political subdivisions, including “taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community”; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City’s Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue public proclamations declaring a State of Local Emergency; and, during a state of emergency, impose certain prohibitions and restrictions to protect lives and safety, including Section 22-53, which provides that such a proclamation may prohibit or restrict the “operation of offices, business establishments and other places to or from which people may travel or at which they may congregate; and other activities or conditions, the control of which may be reasonably necessary to maintain order and protect lives”; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Mayor’s authorization and power under Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 22 of the City’s Code, subsequent to City Council passing Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-14, the Mayor has issued the following proclamations to safeguard the lives, safety, health and welfare of the people within the City:

1. Proclamation 20-015 dated March 25, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit 3); and
2. Proclamation 20-016 dated March 27, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit 4); and

WHEREAS, despite the national, state, and local efforts to limit the further spread of COVID-19, in the six (6) days since City Council passed Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-14, diagnosed cases of COVID-19 and deaths resulting therefrom have continued to increase in Southwest Florida, including in Lee County; and

WHEREAS, for the reasons set forth above, the Mayor of the City of Sanibel finds it necessary and appropriate to extend its State of Local Emergency for an additional period of seven (7) days, in order to continue to take whatever action necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Extension of Declared State of Local Emergency. The Declared State of Local Emergency for all areas within the legal boundaries of the City of Sanibel is hereby extended for a period of seven (7) days and may be further extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor or by Resolution of City Council.

SECTION 2. Extension of Emergency-Related Proclamations. The above-referenced Proclamations (20-011, 20-014, 20-015 as amended by 20-016, and 20-016), including any authorities, restrictions and prohibitions thereunder, are hereby extended and shall remain in force and effect throughout the duration of the current State of Local Emergency, except as extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor or by Resolution of City Council.


SECTION 3. Necessary for Protection. This Proclamation is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare of the community, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Proclamation shall take effect immediately upon execution and remain in effect unless extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor or by Resolution of City Council.



PROCLAMATION AND RESOLUTION NO. 20-011

AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION AND RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL DECLARING A STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency for a period of seven (7) days in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a highly contagious and potentially deadly respiratory illness; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-51 (attached hereto as Exhibit A), directing the Florida Department of Health to declare a Public Health Emergency due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-52 (attached hereto as Exhibit B) declaring a State of Emergency for the State of Florida due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) officially declared COVID-19 a pandemic; and

WHEREAS, March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a Proclamation (attached hereto as Exhibit C), declaring a National Emergency to address the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the President of the United States and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) issued the 15 Days to Slow the Spread (attached hereto as Exhibit D), advising individuals to adopt far-reaching social distancing measures, such as working from home and avoiding gatherings of more than 10 people; and

WHEREAS, the outbreak of COVID-19 has spread to Southwest Florida, including several positive test results and two deaths in Lee County; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, Lee County, Florida passed Emergency Resolution No. 20-03-18 (attached hereto as Exhibit E, less referenced exhibits), declaring a State of Local Emergency for Lee County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-68 (attached hereto as Exhibit F), ordering the suspension of all sales of alcoholic beverages for on premises consumption for 30 days by any licensee authorized to sell alcohol that derives more than 50% of its gross revenue from the sale of



alcoholic beverages (i.e., bars, pubs and nightclubs), ordering public beach gatherings to be limited to no more than 10 persons spaced at least six feet from other parties and supporting beach closures at the discretion of local authorities, and ordering restaurants to immediately limit their occupancy to 50% of its current building capacity and ensuring a six-foot distance between parties of patrons and limiting such parties to no more than 10 individuals.

WHEREAS, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, provides authority for a political subdivision such as the City of Sanibel to declare a State of Local Emergency and to waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required of political subdivisions by law including, but not limited to:

1. Performance of public work and taking whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community.
2. Entering into contracts.
3. Incurring obligations.
4. Employment of permanent and temporary workers.
5. Utilization of volunteer workers.
6. Rental of equipment.
7. Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials and facilities.
8. Appropriation and expenditure of public funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sanibel, pursuant to its home rule powers, has adopted certain emergency procedures, including Chapter 22 of the City's Code; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City's Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue a public proclamation declaring a Local State of Emergency in the event of an existing or threatened state of emergency endangering the lives, safety, health and welfare of the people within the City or any part of it; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED AND RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Declaration of State of Local Emergency. The Sanibel City Council hereby declares a State of Local Emergency for all areas within the legal boundaries of the City of Sanibel. Said State of Local Emergency shall be for a period of seven (7) days and may be extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, or by Resolution of City Council.

SECTION 2. This Proclamation and Resolution is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, welfare and safety, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.

SECTION 3. The Mayor shall have full authority to cancel, postpone or reschedule any public meetings of the City which are currently set within 30 days of the date of this Proclamation and Resolution.

SECTION 4. Effective Date

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.



PROCLAMATION AND RESOLUTION NO. 20-014

AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION AND RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL EXTENDING THE DECLARED STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); RATIFYING CERTAIN MAYORAL PROCLAMATIONS; EMPOWERING THE MAYOR TO CONTINUE TAKING PROTECTIVE ACTIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency for a period of seven (7) days in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a highly contagious and potentially deadly respiratory illness; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-52 declaring a State of Emergency for the State of Florida due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, Lee County, Florida passed Emergency Resolution No. 20-03-18, declaring a State of Local Emergency for Lee County, Florida due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-011, declaring a State of Local Emergency due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sanibel, pursuant to its home rule powers, has adopted certain emergency procedures, including Chapter 22 of the City's Code; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City's Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue public proclamations during a state of emergency, imposing certain prohibitions and restrictions to protect lives, safety health and welfare of the people within the City or any part of it; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Mayor's authorization and power under Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 22 of the City's Code, subsequent to City Council passing Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-11, the Mayor has made the following proclamations to safeguard the lives, safety, health and welfare of the people within the City:

1. By proclamation dated March 18, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit A), ordering closure of certain beach parking facilities at Bowman's Beach, Blind



Pass Gulfside City Park (Algiers), Lighthouse Beach and Fishing Pier, and Trost Parking Lot; and

2. By proclamation dated March 19, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit B), ordering modifications of certain City operations, including closure of City Hall lobbies, remote handling of non-emergency calls by Sanibel Police Department, cancellation of pre-submittal meetings with the Community Services Department, and elimination of in-person payments to the Finance Department; and
3. By additional proclamation dated March 19, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit C), ordering closure of the Recreation Center; and
4. By proclamation dated March 21, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit D), ordering closure of the City boat ramp, boat ramp parking lot, and fishing pier; and
5. By additional proclamation dated March 21, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit E), ordering places of public accommodation to remove all furniture, including beach chairs and lounges, from the beach; remove 75% of all pool deck chairs and lounges from pool decks; strictly adhere to all Center for Disease Control and Florida Department of Health Guidance to stop the spread of COVID-19, including social distancing; and strictly adhere to all components of Governor DeSantis' Executive Order Number 20-71, including but not limited to the required suspension of all sales of alcoholic beverages by the drink or for consumption on premises and closure of gyms and fitness centers; and
6. By proclamation dated March 22, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit F), ordering closure of certain beach parking at the northern terminus of Dixie Beach Road and Bailey Beach Road; and
7. By additional proclamation dated March 22, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit G), ordering modification of the March 21, 2020 proclamation closing the City boat ramp parking lot, to allow "AC" and "A" permit holders access to facilities; and
8. By proclamation dated March 24, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit H), ordering closure of beach parking at the terminus of Beach Road except as to "A" permit holders; and
9. By additional proclamation dated March 24, 2020 (attached hereto as Exhibit I), ordering the cancellation of certain public meetings and special events through April 30, 2020, and modification of City Council liaison duties through April 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the aforementioned proclamations, the City has also closed the Center-4-Life (Senior Center) and cancelled group fitness and personal training classes until further notice, worked with Local Roots, LLC (operator of the

Farmer's Market) to curtail the offerings of the Farmer's Market to food essentials, and worked with numerous other businesses on island to voluntarily curtail certain activities in order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, in the seven (7) days since City Council passed Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-11, diagnosed cases of COVID-19 have continued to increase in Southwest Florida, including in Lee County, and the first confirmed case within the City of Sanibel was announced by public health officials on March 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sanibel, finds it necessary and appropriate to extend its State of Local Emergency for an additional period of seven (7) days, and continue to take whatever action necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED AND RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Extension of Declared State of Local Emergency. The Sanibel City Council hereby extends its State of Local Emergency for all areas within the legal boundaries of the City of Sanibel. Said State of Local Emergency shall be for a period of seven (7) days and may be extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, or by Resolution of City Council.

SECTION 2. Ratification of Mayoral Proclamations. The Sanibel City Council hereby ratifies and affirms the above-referenced mayoral proclamations and restrictions under the State of Local Emergency which shall persist and be enforceable throughout the duration of the current State of Local Emergency, except as extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, or by Resolution of City Council.

SECTION 3. Necessary for Protection. This Proclamation and Resolution is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, welfare and safety, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.


SECTION 4. Continuing Mayoral Authority. The Mayor shall continue to have full authority to cancel, postpone or reschedule any public meetings of the City which are currently set within 30 days of the date of this Proclamation and Resolution, as well as to continue to make any proclamations imposing prohibitions or restrictions permissible under Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, or Chapter 22 of the City's Code, in furtherance of safeguarding the lives, safety, health and welfare of the people within the City.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.





AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL CLOSING CERTAIN BEACH PARKING LOT FACILITIES IN CONNECTION WITH THE CITY'S STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency for a period of seven (7) days in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, at 10:52 a.m. on March 18, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel declared a State of Local Emergency resulting from the outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City's Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue public proclamations during a state of emergency, imposing certain prohibitions and restrictions to protect lives and safety.

WHEREAS, social distancing guidelines and limitations on public gatherings have been detailed in guidance by the federal and state government, including 15 Days to Slow the Spread issued by President of the United States and the Center for Disease Control (CDC), as well as Executive Order Number 20-68 issued by the Governor of the State of Florida;

WHEREAS, in keeping with such guidelines and in an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19 and protect the lives and safety of the City's residents, visitors and the greater community, the Mayor finds it appropriate to close certain beach parking lot facilities; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Closure of certain beach parking facilities. The Mayor hereby orders the closure of the following paid parking facilities: Bowman's Beach, Blind Pass Gulfside City Park (Algiers), Lighthouse Beach and Fishing Pier, and Trost Parking Lot. Said closure shall be for the same period of time as the City's State of Local Emergency declared by Proclamation and Resolution Number 20-011 (as may be extended, amended or modified), and may be extended, modified or terminated by written Proclamation of the Mayor of the City of Sanibel or by Resolution of City Council.

SECTION 2. This Proclamation is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, welfare and safety, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.



PROCLAMATION NO. 20-013

AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL IN CONNECTION WITH THE CITY'S STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); CANCELLING CERTAIN PUBLIC MEETINGS; CANCELLING CERTAIN SPECIAL EVENTS; MODIFYING CERTAIN CITY COUNCIL LIAISON DUTIES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency for a period of seven (7) days in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, at 10:52 a.m. on March 18, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel declared a State of Local Emergency resulting from the outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City's Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue public proclamations during a state of emergency, imposing certain prohibitions and restrictions to protect lives and safety.

WHEREAS, social distancing guidelines and limitations on public gatherings have been detailed in guidance by the federal and state government, including 15 Days to Slow the Spread issued by President of the United States and the Center for Disease Control (CDC), as well as Executive Order Number 20-68 issued by the Governor of the State of Florida;

WHEREAS, in keeping with such guidelines and in an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19 and protect the lives and safety of the City's residents, visitors and the greater community, the Mayor finds it appropriate to cancel certain public meetings and special events, and to temporarily modify certain City Council liaison duties; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Cancellation of Certain Public Meetings. All public meetings of any committee, commission, board or other public meeting of the City of Sanibel are cancelled through April 30, 2020, less and except meetings of the City Council.

SECTION 2. Cancellation of Certain Special Events. All special events permits issued by the City for any special event to occur through April 30, 2020 are hereby revoked or otherwise cancelled.

SECTION 3. Modification of Certain City Council Liaison Duties. All liaison duties of City Council members are hereby modified through April 30, 2020, to authorize participation by any reasonable means other than strictly in-person participation.


SECTION 4. Necessary for Protection. This Proclamation is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, welfare and safety, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Proclamation shall take effect immediately upon execution.



PROCLAMATION NO. 20-015

AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL IN CONNECTION WITH THE CITY'S STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); SUPPORTING THE GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER 20-71 PROHIBITION OF THE SALE OF ALCOHOL FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION; RESTRICTING THE FARMER'S MARKET FROM SELLING ANY NON-FOOD ITEMS; PROHIBITING THE RENTAL OF ANY PLACE OF PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION FOR LODGING OR "UNLIMITED RENTAL" FROM RENTING FOR A PERIOD OF LESS THAN SEVEN DAYS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-52, declaring a State of Emergency for the State of Florida; and


WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution Number 20-011, declaring a State of Local Emergency for the City of Sanibel resulting from the outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-014, extending the State of Local Emergency

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3), Florida Statutes, provides certain emergency powers to political subdivisions, including "taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community"; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City's Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue public proclamations during a state of emergency, imposing certain prohibitions and restrictions to protect lives and safety, including Section 22-53, which provides that such a proclamation may prohibit or restrict, the "operation of offices, business establishments and other places to or from which people may travel or at which they may congregate; and other activities or conditions, the control of which may be reasonably necessary to maintain order and protect lives"; and

WHEREAS, in the Sanibel City Council's March 25, 2020 special meeting, the Council expressed unanimous support for taking certain additional measures to encourage social distancing and discourage non-essential activity within City limits, in order to protect the lives and safety of the City's residents; and



WHEREAS, those additional measures included providing additional support for the Governor's Executive Order 20-71 prohibition of alcohol sales for on-premises consumption (attached hereto as Exhibit A), restricting the Farmer's Market from selling any non-food items, and prohibiting the rental of any place of public accommodation for lodging or "unlimited rental" from being rented for a period of less than seven days; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Prohibition of Alcohol Sales for On-Premises Consumption. Consistent with the Governor's Executive Order Number 20-71, vendors licensed to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises are prohibited from selling alcoholic beverages by the drink or in sealed containers for consumption on the premises. "Sell" or "selling" for the purposes of this proclamation means provide—irrespective of monetary or other consideration provided or not provided in exchange for the alcoholic beverage. "Premises" for the purpose of this proclamation means not only the actual premises where the point of sale occurred but also any public or common areas within any resort, hotel, motel, or other place of public accommodation operated in common or connection with the actual premises where the point of sale occurred.

SECTION 2. Farmer's Market Restrictions. The Farmer's Market operated on City property is hereby restricted from selling any non-food items.

SECTION 3. Temporary Restrictions on Lodging Rentals. Effective immediately, any place of public accommodation for lodging, including any resort housing, inn, hotel, motel, or other establishment which provides lodging to transient guests, or any "unlimited rental" as defined by Sanibel Code Section 126-1075, is prohibited from making or accepting reservations for lodging rentals of less than seven consecutive days during the period of Saturday, March 28, 2020 through April 30, 2020, and is further ordered to cancel any reservations during this period of restriction which are for a duration of less than seven days. Nothing herein shall act to reduce the minimum duration restrictions of any place of public accommodation for lodging or any "limited rental" as defined by Sanibel Code Section 126-1075.

SECTION 4. Necessary for Protection. This Proclamation is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare of the community, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.



PROCLAMATION NO. 20-016

AN EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL IN CONNECTION WITH THE CITY'S STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESULTING FROM THE OUTBREAK OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19); TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING THE RENTAL OF ANY "UNLIMITED RENTAL" OR OTHER PLACE OF PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION FOR LODGING; TEMPORARILY CLOSING THE COMMUNITY PARK PLAYGROUND; TEMPORARILY CLOSING CERTAIN PUBLIC PARKING; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority to a political subdivision of the State of Florida to declare a State of Local Emergency in order to take whatever action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 20-52, declaring a State of Emergency for the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution Number 20-011, declaring a State of Local Emergency for the City of Sanibel resulting from the outbreak of COVID-19; and


WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Proclamation and Resolution No. 20-014, extending the State of Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the number of confirmed COVID-19 cases continues to rise throughout the country, the State of Florida, and Lee County, with at least two cases now confirmed within the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 252.38(3), Florida Statutes, provides certain emergency powers to political subdivisions, including "taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community"; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 22 of the City's Code authorizes and empowers the Mayor to issue public proclamations during a state of emergency, imposing certain prohibitions and restrictions to protect lives and safety, including Section 22-53, which provides that such a proclamation may prohibit or restrict, the "operation of offices, business establishments and other places to or from which people may travel or at which they may congregate; and other activities or conditions, the control of which may be reasonably necessary to maintain order and protect lives"; and

WHEREAS, in the Sanibel City Council's March 27, 2020 special meeting, the Council unanimously passed a motion to take certain additional measures to limit



community spread of COVID-19, encourage social distancing and discourage non-essential activity within City limits, in order to protect the lives and safety of the City's residents; and

WHEREAS, such motion approved a temporary prohibition on the rental of any "unlimited rental" or other place of public accommodation for lodging from the period of March 28, 2020 through April 24, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor also finds it necessary and appropriate to close the Community Park playground and certain additional public parking lots, in order to mitigate community spread of COVID-19; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the City of Sanibel, Florida:

SECTION 1. Temporary Restrictions on Accommodation Rentals. All "unlimited rentals" as such term is defined by Sanibel Code Section 126-1075 (whether a single family home, condominium, timeshare or otherwise), and any other place of public accommodation for lodging, including any resort housing, inn, hotel, motel, or other establishment which provides lodging to transient guests, are hereby ordered to cancel all existing reservations and refrain from accepting new guests or making new reservations for stays for the booking period commencing 12:01 a.m. Saturday, March 28, 2020 through 11:59 p.m. April 24, 2020. Any guests of such accommodations who are checked in as of Friday, March 27, 2020 are permitted to remain for the duration of their stay. This prohibition does not affect the ability of an owner of a condominium, timeshare or any other property which is periodically rented to third parties from staying in his or her own property for some or all of the restricted period. This prohibition supersedes and replaces the accommodation restrictions previously employed by Proclamation 20-015.

SECTION 2. Temporary Closure of Community Park Playground. Effective immediately, the City of Sanibel Community Park playground, located at 2221 Periwinkle Way, is temporarily closed until further notice. The remainder of the Park remains open.

SECTION 3. Temporary Closure of Public Parking. Effective March 28, 2020, the following public parking lots are temporarily closed until further notice: Community Park parking lot, Pond Apple Park Trailhead and Chamber Visitor Center parking lot, Recreation Center parking lot, and Roadside Park parking lot.

SECTION 4. Necessary for Protection. This Proclamation is an emergency measure necessary for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare of the community, due to the serious threat of COVID-19.


