**Sanibel Recycles!!  
Reduce-Reuse-Recycle**

- Car batteries, and oil can be taken to the Sanibel Shell Station, 2435 Periwinkle Way (472-2012) for recycling
- Batteries such as AAA, AA, C, D, 9 Volt and most button cells manufactured since 1993, have no mercury and are considered non-hazardous. These batteries may be disposed of in the household garbage
- In 2005, the City initiated an annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. January 28, 2006 has been designated as the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day for 2006.
