

Upon moving to Sanibel in 1999, I began devoting full-time to a museum management consulting practice that I started part-time in 1978. Altogether I have advised 40 museums throughout the U.S. and Canada including three start ups.

I've been fortunate to advance my life-long commitment to historic preservation as the first museum professional on the board of the Travel Industry Association of America and as an associate member of the Society of American Travel Writers. In 1993 I proposed the residents of Sanibel for the Society of American Travel Writers' highest recognition, the Phoenix Award, in tribute to the Island's commitment to preservation of its history and environment. Society judges voted for Sanibel marking the first time the Phoenix had recognized the residents of a community. I was pleased to be able to present the award at a MacKenzie Hall ceremony January 28, 1994.

Beginning in 1974 I served as External Relations Officer for Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village. The Village, with its nearly 100 historic buildings, is the nation's first and largest historic preservation site. Here I led the strategy team that helped shift the institution from single source to broad-based funding and directed a marketing and external relations program that throughout my tenure generated the largest attendance of any independent history museum in North America. Through my work I learned ways that the worthiness of a preservation project could be determined, how its educational potential could be assessed and how its implementation could be achieved. I was pleased to be given the opportunity to lead the reinstallation of the original Wright Cycle Shop that had been moved from Dayton to be preserved in Greenfield Village.

In 1996 I left Henry Ford Museum & Greenfield Village to become Director of the Automotive Hall of Fame Museum, a start up museum for which I became the lead planner. My work involved all aspects of transforming the broad vision of international automotive industry leaders into a successful new museum and educational resource that was built and sustained with unprecedented industry collaboration.

In the mid 1990s I was a management consultant involved with all phases of transforming a small historical society into the Orange County Regional History Center in Orlando which is now Florida's largest regional history center.

I moved to Sanibel in 1999 conducting a museum management consulting practice from home. Soon after moving here, I lead a year-long community-based strategic planning process for the Edison/Ford Foundation that resulted in the Edison and Ford Homes in Fort Myers being privatized.

From 2006 to 2009, as part of my consulting practice, I was lead consultant for the creation of a new museum for the Cade Museum Foundation in Gainesville where I was the point person with the building architect, exhibit design firm and fundraising counsel. I served as Acting Director in 2009.

Currently I am overall management advisor on the new Elliott Museum being constructed on Hutchinson Island, Florida and Content and Interpretive Consultant to Synergy Design Group in Tallahassee, specialists in museum exhibits. One of the Elliott's primary objectives is the preservation of the only federal house of refuge remaining in the U.S. These positions have required extensive historical research and collaboration with schools in developing educational programs that meet the needs of Florida educators.

I served on the board of Preservation Wayne, Wayne County, Michigan, and on Michigan and Florida cultural tourism task forces and was recruited by the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs to review submissions for Museum General Programs Support grants.

I was a Congressional delegate and program planner for the 1997 White House Conference On Travel and Tourism. Later I was delegated to conference in Bonn, Germany to provide planning and policy advice to emerging museums and preservation organizations located in former Eastern Bloc countries. I have advised on cultural tourism programs in collaboration with state historic preservation and museum departments including Hawaii and Alaska.

I am author of the book Museum Public Relations, was an adjunct instructor in the Eastern Michigan University graduate program in museum management and was a founder of and instructor in the University of Kansas Museum Marketing and Public Relations Institute. I have served on National Trust for Historic Preservation, Smithsonian, Colonial Williamsburg, American Association of Museums and American Association for State and Local History faculties

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:

Up to this point my involvement in Sanibel has been limited by work load and travel requirements. I have volunteered at Ding Darling Days, have been a turtle walker for SCCF for several years and have been active with Saint Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church including serving on the vestry, facilitating strategic planning prior to the most recent facility addition, chairing the Outreach Commission and chairing the Search Committee for a new rector.

WHY ARE YOU INTERESTED IN THIS APPOINTMENT:

I have reached a point in my career where I would like to begin to cut back on fee-based projects and devote volunteer time to giving back to the Sanibel community which we've been a part of for eleven happy years. I would welcome the opportunity to offer my experience as a resource to others on the committee and in the community on issues involving historic preservation. I have reviewed postings on the committee web link and would like to participate in the whole range of its work. I would find it especially attractive to participate in an inclusive exploration of the future use of the Sanibel lighthouse.


