**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by City Council of the City of Sanibel, Florida:



Dear James,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees of SCCF I am writing to confirm support for the construction of a boardwalk connector across the City's Schlosser Preserve and improvements to the Pond Apple Park trail system and its connection to the "Shipley Trail" to be developed on the SCCF Bailey Homestead Preserve.

In association with SCCF's Shipley Trail, this boardwalk will provide a great connection within the City's existing system creating a continuous path from the Chamber of Commerce to Roadside Park on Periwinkle. It will provide access to a variety of habitats including canopied Buttonwood slough and West Indian Hammock away from busy roadways.

SCCF will provide \$82,000 for boardwalk construction and other improvements that are a part of the project. We will also commit to secure volunteer labor for assistance with construction if needed.

The \$82,000 represents contributions received by SCCF for the Starr Thomas Memorial Fund in memory of Starr and her association with the development of Sanibel's initial bike path system.

These funds are readily available to transfer to the City when needed.

We look forward to partnering with the City on this Community project.
